Feedback Obtained

If teacher is in need of any shortcoming of teaching aids (like instrument, elibrary etc.) it is provided immediately so that knowledge transfer process should not get hampered. Parents meet is organized every semester and College works on their suggestion for overall development of dept or institute. The attendance, result and other related information of each student is shared with the parents each semester so that they should know the academic progress of their ward.
